

#### CURIOSITY

One morning as I sat at my kitchen table sipping coffee, I saw something unusual through the glass door to my backyard. I often gaze contently outside at the greenery and colourful flower beds, and the comings and goings of birds and squirrels. But that day my contentment turned quickly into curiosity! Something *white* caught my attention. The busy birdfeeder had a *visitor* other than the usual collection of sparrows, juncos, nut hatches, and siskins. It was the size and shape of a *finch*, but its feathers were pure white! I carefully reached for my iphone, but before I could get its camera ready, the bird had flown away.

What to do now? Ask "SIRI," of course: "ARE THERE WHITE FINCHES?"

My curiosity led me link to link: *birdscanada.org* to *feederwatch.org*. I found that my backyard visitor fit the description of a not uncommon type of finch, yet rare enough that few people have seen one. I learned that white feathers and pale legs and beak result from a genetic mutation preventing production of the melanin which gives animals their colouring. The black eyes in mine, however, mean it is a partial-albino "**leucistic finch.**" I found posted reports and photos from sightings in various places, but none from Canada.

What has happened since then? The white finch has continued to visit my backyard. I now have iphone photos and a video. The bird has a name: "*Ange*" (*Angel in French*). Birds Canada has a new member, and a sighting is now posted from Saanichton BC.
